What is school choice?

The School Choice Program allows non-resident students to enroll at Audubon High School at no cost to the parents/guardians. The individuals accepted through the School Choice Program would become actual full-time students at Audubon High School for the remainder of their high school experience and receive an Audubon diploma upon the successful fulfillment of all graduation requirements.

In order to be considered for acceptance, applicants must be eligible to enroll as a high school student (Grades 9 - 12) for the 2013 - 2014 school year.



In addition all prospective students must have attended school for the full 2012 - 2013 school year and live within twenty miles of Audubon High School.

FAQ's

How many students will be accepted through the School Choice Program?

For the 2013 - 2014 school year, Audubon High School will be accepting twenty-five students in Grade 9 and one student in Grade 10, five students in Grade 11 and five students in Grade 12 resulting in a total of forty-one students.

What are the steps in the application process?

How will the District select the non-resident Choice Program students?

Choice Program students will be admitted to Audubon High School through a random, unbiased process.

Each student application will be initially screened for completeness. If the number of applications for Choice Program seats exceeds the number available, Audubon High School will conduct a lottery. Each application will be assigned a number, and numbers will be drawn in the lottery to fill all available seats. Once the available seats have been filled, additional numbers will be drawn in order to establish a "Wait List" in the event that seats become available at a later date.

the application process and to answer all questions that parents/guardians may have.
