

MINIMUM GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

All student must earn a total of 120 credits in the following areas:

- 20 credits in English
- 20 credits in Physical Education and Health
- 15 credits in Mathematics
- 15 credits in Science, including two lab or inquiry based sciences
- 15 credits in Social Studies, including 10 credits in US History and 5 credits in World History
- 5 credits in World Language
- 5 credits in Visual and Performing Arts
- 5 credits in Career Education and Consumer, family, and life skills or vocational-technical education
- 2.5 credits in economics

TEACHER RECOMMENDATIONS

- Teacher recommendations are based on your performance in class, aptitude, work ethic and the required prerequisites that you've completed
- Teacher recommendations are visible in Parent and Student Genesis
- You can speak with your teachers about recommendations; they can give you advice about what you need to change and/or improve

YOUR SCHEDULE WILL BE BASED ON:

- A minimum of 6 full-year classes (not including study hall or independent study)
- Core subject classes required for graduation (i.e. English, Math, Science, Social Studies, PE/Health & World Language)
- Credits required for graduation
